Teaching

In 2009 I co-created and offered Gender and Population Health Research as an advanced graduate course. In 1991 developed two graduate courses for the Department of Community Health Sciences: Health Promotion (645.12); and Health Program Planning and Evaluation (659.03) and taught these for a number of years. These courses are still offered, 645.12 by other faculty and 659.03 by myself (last offered Spring 2013). I also chaired the Family Unit, Human Development, in undergraduate medicine and developed the Family Violence course. I periodically lecture in other graduate courses and in undergraduate courses in other faculties, such as, Women's Studies. In 1998, I chaired the committee to develop and deliver a

new course: Introduction to Community Health Sciences, and collaborated with the University of Alberta in providing 659.03 as a distance education, web-based course. In 2001 I developed and delivered a new web-based course, Health Promotion with Women that was also offered by the University of Alberta. I have regularly taught sections of Qualitative Research Methods (659.02) and provided independent study courses for graduate students. Through the Faculty of Medicine's partnership with Weill Bugando University College of Health Sciences, I developed curricula for MPH 607 & 609 – Health Promotion and Global Health and co-taught these two course with Dr. Jennifer Hatfield in Mwanza, Tanzania, May 2011, May 2012 and November 2013; co-taught same with Dr. Stephanie Mntessanti, April 2016.
