Our renewed Action Plan reflects a whole-of-campus approach. Together, we are building capacity for a sustainable future through education, research, and community engagement while embedding sustainability in operational practices. Together, we are igniting local and global impact.

Advance Sustainability Education

Through a renewed Academic Sustainability Advisory Committee, we will:

- Establish campus sustainability literacy goals and undertake a sustainability literacy assessment.
- Explore how the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and key sustainability objectives can be applied to teaching and learning.
- Provide resources to enhance delivery of sustainability-focused curricula while expanding course offerings, research opportunities and experiential learning in sustainability.



Advance Sustainability Research and Innovation

As the new host of Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) Canada, we will:

- Establish collaborative spaces to foster connections and partnerships for sustainability research between Indigenous groups, students, faculty and researchers.
- Create initiatives that engage transdisciplinary scholarship to advance sustainability goals.
- Develop skill-enhancing programs for training in sustainability innovation and experiential learning.



Enrich Engagement for Sustainability

Through a renewed Sustainability Engagement Advisory Committee and as host for SDSN Canada we will:

- Provide forums for engagement with the SDGs while increasing resources to help people take action for sustainability.
- Increase resources, such as an open-source sustainability data system, to support sustainability research, practices, and reporting.
- Foster understanding and awareness by sharing UCalgary's sustainability impact stories and engaging in global sustainability rankings.



Grow Campus Sustainability

Through shared leadership and collaborative action, we will:

- Advance targeted action on climate change, ecohealth and responsible consumption, including supporting policies, practices and performance metrics.
- With guidance from Indigenous Elders, create parallel pathways in ways of doing in land and building approaches.
- Engage UCalgary scholars in design sprints for campus sustainability challenges.
- Identify international declarations, that UCalgary can participate in, to increase sustainability collaborations.

INDIGENOUS PATH FOR SUSTAINABILITY ACTION

From the Elders' Circle for Sustainability

- Explore processes to protect and sustain Elders' teachings, and to transfer oral teachings to an oral library and a written system at UCalgary.
- Create spaces to build a common understanding of trust and respect.
 Ethical spaces come after trust and respect.
- Recognize and connect the parallel paths;
 deepen understanding of invisible traditional infrastructure and our shared path.
- Identify cultural symbols to teach and guide sustainability action, and create a parfleche starting with UCalgary's sustainability creation story to inform the symbols.

Ways of Being & Connecting

- Explore ways to share the teachings of older relatives to deepen understanding of sustainability action, including caring for land and community, relational thinking, reciprocity, balance, and being a good relative; maintaining our relationship with older relatives.*
- Build trust and relationships with Indigenous communities to better connect UCalgary's research and teaching for sustainability with Indigenous perspectives.
- Learn about our role in taking care of our current kinships and future relatives; develop resources for relationality in sustainability.



- Expand the understanding of sustainability values and principles from Indigenous knowledge systems, and share them with the campus community.*
- Create pathways and spaces that immerse students in learning about trust, respect and parallel knowledge, including both visible and invisible traditional infrastructure.
- Create safe spaces for truth-telling about sustainability and reconciliation.



Ways of Knowing (Agenda)

- Develop courses, including land-based opportunities, for students to learn about sustainability from traditional Indigenous perspectives.
- Establish traditional gardens and healing spaces at UCalgary for relationship learning.
- Within an Elders' Circle, further explore how to promote gratitude and reciprocity.
