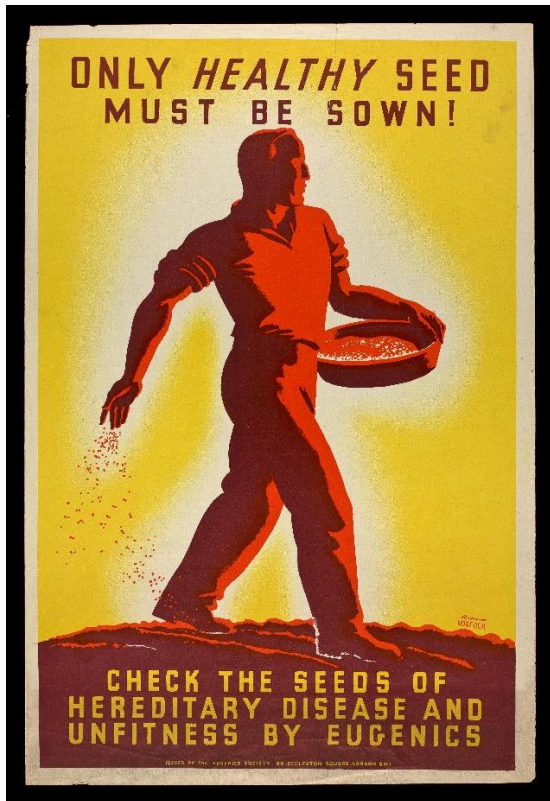

**“The Great and Only Solution:” Support and Opposition to  
Sexual Sterilization in Alberta and Manitoba**



This presentation looks at how various interest groups exercised political power to influence the eugenics debates over sexual sterilization legislation in Alberta and Manitoba during the early twentieth century. The differing political landscapes and dynamics of these two provinces served to empower eugenics supporters in Alberta and anti-eugenics groups in Manitoba. This shows how the international eugenics agenda interacted with local conditions, and how the legislation of health policy reflected the subtle differences in the societies and political landscapes that considered it.
