

Canada Research Chair (CRC) Tier I, Precision Therapeutics, Cumming School of Medicine

This position is open to internal academic staff at the University of Calgary

The Cumming School of Medicine at the University of Calgary invites internal applications for a Canada Research Chair (CRC) Tier I in the area of Precision Therapeutics, with a focus on inflammatory disorders in adults and/or children.

The candidate will have expertise in identifying and delineating disease mechanisms with the goal of developing precision therapies for conditions such as inflammatory bowel disease. The ideal candidate will be a clinician-scientist with an internationally reputed research program, and a strong research record as a collaborator and mentor.

The successful candidate will be a recognized leader and an innovative world-class researcher with major impact in their field. They will have a superior track record of attracting and supervising trainees at various levels of their career.

The Chair will establish an active research program that focuses on precision therapeutics, with a focus on inflammatory disorders in adults and/or children. The successful candidate will foster collaboration amongst other disciplines within the University of Calgary and Alberta Health Services; provide leadership in the development of a multidisciplinary and collaborative research program; support transfer of new knowledge into improvements in clinical practice and best practice policies; attract and mentor trainees and junior faculty. Additionally, the candidate will play an important role in education and the training of highly qualified individuals in relevant multidisciplinary undergraduate and graduate programs. Service to the department, faculty, University, and community is also expected.
