



## First-Generation Scholars Program (FGSP) Mentorship Excellence Award

The Mentor Excellence Award recognizes mentors who have demonstrated exceptional leadership, empathy, reflexivity, community-building, and ambassadorship during their participation in the First-Generation Scholars Program. Recipients will be celebrated at the end of the academic year and receive formal recognition for their contributions to the FGSP community.

### Eligibility

To be eligible to receive the FGSP Mentor Excellence Award students must:

- Be a current or past First-Generation Mentor at the University of Calgary.
- Have completed at least one term of active mentorship.
- Be in good academic and conduct<sup>1</sup> standing.
- Submit an application between March 1-May 15 at 11:59PM through self-nomination or be nominated by a mentee or peer.

### Application Process

#### Nominations

Mentors may self-nominate or be nominated by a mentee.

#### Submissions can take multiple forms:

- Written statement (max. 500 words) which outlines three competencies you have showcased within your contributions to the program.
  - This can be completed in Word or PDF format and submitted by email to [firstgenprograms@ucalgary.ca](mailto:firstgenprograms@ucalgary.ca).
- Short video or audio recording (3–5 minutes) which outlines three competencies you have showcased within your contributions to the program.
  - This can be completed with your own audio or video recording equipment or through [Lab NEXT](#) on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Taylor Family Digital Library labelled TFDL on the [map of campus](#). Recordings can be submitted to [firstgenprograms@ucalgary.ca](mailto:firstgenprograms@ucalgary.ca).



- The [First-Generation Scholars Program Mentorship Excellence Award Reflection Assignment](#) can be completed by answering the guiding questions for three competencies. Choose three competencies and answer all the questions for those competencies.

### Application Support

- Structured prompts and rubrics are provided to ensure transparency and clarity.
- Workshops in February will support students in preparing strong applications.
- Students can book an appointment with a member of the First-Generation team to discuss their application.

### Evaluation Criteria

Select three competencies to showcase your contribution to the program that also highlights your strengths

Competencies	Description	Guiding Questions
<b>Leadership</b>	Volunteered at events, initiated activities, showed initiative in program roles.	What events/activities did you volunteer for? How did you show initiative?
<b>Empathy &amp; Support</b>	Actively listened to mentees, responded to concerns, made referrals, demonstrated care.	How did you show care and responsiveness? Can you share an example of supporting a mentee?
<b>Reflexivity &amp; Growth</b>	Showed self-awareness, reflective learning, and growth from feedback.	What did you learn about yourself? How did you adjust based on feedback?
<b>Community-Building</b>	Fostered belonging, built connections, contributed to program culture.	How did you create belonging or connect students?
<b>Ambassadorship</b>	Represented the program positively and promoted it to peers.	How did you encourage others to join/recognize FGSP?

Each application will be reviewed by at least two independent reviewers. Final selections are made by the **Mentor Award Committee**.

### Generative AI (GenAI) Use Policy

Applicants may use Generative AI tools (such as ChatGPT) to support their application but must disclose how the tool was used. [Graduate AI Guidelines | Faculty of Graduate Studies | University of Calgary](#)

- Generative AI use must be transparent (e.g., grammar check, idea refinement).



- Applications must reflect the applicant’s own voice and experiences.
- At the end of the application, include a short disclosure statement, for example:
  - “I used ChatGPT to refine grammar in my reflection. All ideas and experiences are my own.”
