

Awards, Scholarships and Bursaries

(for International Undergraduate Students)

International students may be eligible for awards that are not specifically for Canadian citizens or Permanent Residents and must be registered **full-time** to be eligible.



What are my options?

International undergraduate students can apply for UCalgary **entrance awards** for new students, **continuing awards** for those who've completed at least one year at UCalgary, **merit-based scholarships** for academic achievements, and **need-based bursaries** for those experiencing financial challenges. There are also **external awards** offered by governments and private organizations.

How do I Apply for UCalgary awards?

Submit an application for each available awards competition and be considered for all the awards you're eligible for.

- Login to your myUCalgary Student Portal
- Click on "My Financials"
- Scroll down to the Awards & Scholarships section, and click on "Apply for Undergraduate Awards"
- Complete and submit your application(s) before the posted deadlines



Common Awards/Bursaries for Undergrad International Students

- CONTINUING UNDERGRADUATE AWARDS
 - <u>UCalgary International Undergraduate Award</u> \$5,000. Application Period: March May.
- UNDERGRADUATE BURSARIES COMPETITION
 - o <u>International Student Financial Need Bursary</u> \$1,500. Application Period: March May.
 - Student Peer Assistant Bursary Up to \$1,000. Application Period: September April.

Awards, Scholarships and Bursaries

(for International Graduate Students)

International students registered in a graduate degree program at the University of Calgary may be eligible for awards and financial assistance. Students must be registered **full-time** to be eligible.



What are my options?

International graduate students can access financial assistance from the university in the form of **Graduate and Research Assistantships** (Teaching and Non-Teaching), **GSA bursaries**, and from the **Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS) Scholarships**. Where do I look?

Students should contact their **program administrator** for information about available awards and their eligibility, application deadlines and procedures.

- Faculty of Graduate Studies (FGS): Explore all award opportunities and deadlines using the Graduate Awards Database at
 grad.ucalgary.ca/awards (select International in the Citizenship category). Find some of the major award opportunities for
 international graduate applicants here.
- Graduate Student Association (GSA): The GSA provides financial support in the way of bursaries and grants.



How do I Apply for UCalgary awards?

You are encouraged to apply for awards when you have submitted your admissions application and received your UCalgary student number (UCID). You are not automatically submitted for awards. It is important to read the eligibility requirements and follow the application instructions for each award you are considering.

- 1. Look for Awards: Review the Graduate Awards Database (select International in the Citizenship category).
- 2. Know your eligibility: Once you found some awards, verify your eligibility and learn about the award regulations.
- 3. Prepare your application: Prepare the required documents and learn how to submit your award applications.
