

Working in Canada as an International Student

In order to work in Canada as an international student, you must be enrolled as a full-time student and have a valid study permit.

Requirements

- Be enrolled as a full-time student in an in-person program at the university of Calgary
- Valid study permit with stated work conditions
- A **Social Insurance Number (SIN)**. Visit ISS <u>"SIN" webpage</u> for more information on how to apply for a SIN.
- An updated copy of your **resume** or your **CV** (CV is used primarily for research and academic positions), and a **cover letter**. Refer to the job posting for instructions on how to submit a complete application.

Working opportunities

Working on-campus



- There are no legal restrictions on the number of hours you can work on-campus, as long as you remain a full-time student. (You can work multiple jobs on-campus)
- On-campus work means working for either the University of Calgary itself or for a vendor located on the physical campus (including main campus, downtown campus, Spyhill campus, Foothills Hospital, and McMahon Stadium).
- There are several on-campus work opportunities available. For a complete list of opportunities and how to apply, access the campus-wide job board in **Elevate**. Log in as a student, then select the "job board" tab on the left.



Working off-campus

- You are allowed to work off-campus 24 hours per week during regular academic sessions.
- Can work **full-time during scheduled breaks**, as long as you remain a full-time student before and after your break.
- You do not need a work permit provided that your study permit allows you to work under the conditions listed on your permit.



Co-op (cooperative education) or internship

Co-op work permits allow international students to work full-time while still being enrolled full-time.
 You may only apply and use this work permit to work full-time during your co-op/practicum term(s) in a work placement authorized by your <u>University of Calgary co-op/practicum office</u>. or if your program has a required practicum/co-op that you must complete to obtain your degree.

Frequently Asked Questions

When should I apply for a job?

• Many on-campus opportunities are posted a couple months prior to the semester start date, but other opportunities may be available throughout the year. Prior to the start of the semester, you may find posters around campus advertising on-campus opportunities or see posts on social media.

What should I do if I don't have any previous work experience?

• If you don't have any previous Canadian work experience, you may consider finding **volunteer opportunities** to start building experience. To find information about volunteering opportunities at UCalgary, you can search the word "volunteer" on ucalgary.ca.
